
Spoglie: studio #2

Eleonora Gugliotta was born in 1989 in Capo d'Orlando, Italy, and has graduated from the Brera Academy of Fine Arts in Milan in Contemporary Decoration. Her first mature orientation to contemporary art takes place through photography, then passing to prefer the use of organic matter to explore human experience and condition. She has participated in various group exhibitions, presenting installations, photographic projects, videos and performances and his first exhibition dates back to 2015 personal at Piero Manzoni's former studio in Milan. In 2019 she was the winner of the Paratissima Talent Prize of Paratissima Art Fair in Turin.

Her productions reflect on contemporary society, and her investigation is aimed at exploring the intimate and deeper sphere of individuals. In particular, it looks at the difficulty that the human being encounters in reuniting with his nature, in adapting to changing scenarios, the poor observation skills and analyses often distorted by mental schemes and social constructs. In his works, the artist has always preferred the use of natural filaments - be they wool, hair or hair transforming them into real signs, strokes like those outlined by a pen that draws what the hand orders and the mind decides. Relative to the space of action they are like microelements that become at the same time points of connection and junction as well as visible trails of the movement of man in space. Along with geographical maps, hair is one of the two main elements compared and on which the game of stairs created with the Spoglie series of collages focuses. Over the random signs and shapes of the maps - formed by roads, rivers and coasts - the artist superimposes a tangle of hair that becomes one with the surface, creating new paths. The natural element takes on soft and sinuous shapes, contrasting with the often-angular signs of the maps and symbolically tracing the chaotic flow of man on earth. In a game between micro and macro, organic traces of man are mixed with paths made invisible, but both designed following the typically human nature of transforming the space around oneself.



REA Art Fair draws inspiration from the concept of the Biennale - aiming to avoid solely direct relationships with the galleries and instead collaborating directly with emerging artists. And thus, an idea of introducing a storyline sprung; the Fair is divided into six sections that have been formed upon the completion of the selection of the 100 artists: humanity - works of artists whose practice embodies the conception; figurative - a representation, a portrayal of recognizable forms; neutral palette - focusing on the often monochromatic, naive depiction of nature - both human and the organic one; transitioning to nature - artists working with biologically-derived materials, captivated by the natural form; technology - subjects that touch on man-made objects and ideas; and lastly varied - the artworks that can't be confined within a particular category due to their expansive subject matter.

We place The Artist at the center of our focus, not only their selected works. We firmly believe that the 100 creators selected and exhibited at the Fair have tremendous potential, and immense space for growth, which ultimately were both criteria for their selection. They are all emerging artists, without extensive exhibiting experience, to whom we want to give a chance of becoming a part of the art scene. For us, the medium - whether that was painting, video art, or a performance piece had little to do with our final decisions, what was essential was the execution - if the idea that the Artist was searching to communicate, corresponded to the visual representation.

REA Art Fair acts as a platform, a starting point, a link between an emerging artist and the art world. The artists' evaluation is based on guidelines that also consider the different career points - like that the Fair acts as a kick-start, ensuring steady artistic growth in their future career.

We are working towards creating a more intimate communication between the society and the emerging artists, as well as the curators. As you walk through the Fair, you might find yourself following a path, a natural flow, a connection between the artworks as an intricate storyline unfolds before your eyes. The artists haven't been conditioned to work on a specific subject; we want to unite them so that a beautiful connection between all the art pieces and the exhibition space of Fabbrica Del Vapore will be created. The reason why we have so many types of artworks ranging from oil paintings to performing arts is because we aim to change society's point of view about the value of art. It isn't just about collecting or decorating your home, but rather about creating a connection with the world as a political being where you begin to own, sustain and encourage ideas.
